"Wow, how exciting, which play?". My reply, "Northanger Abbey", saw faces morph from jubilation to sheer blank expression.

Admittedly, not one of her well known!

Comparing the novel and the script I recognised there were minor differences, but appreciated Matthew Francis' version. He has with integrity, taken the work of the romantic novelist and created a fast paced journey for the heroine Catherine Morland by means of pure entertainment and delight.

Catherine's journey takes us on an adventure between her fantasy world of the gothic novel 'Udolpho' and the reality of her new societal life at Bath. As these two worlds head toward an inevitable clash, it is the novels hero, Mr Tilney that awakens her to the wisdom of, "we mustn't allow what we read to effect how we behave".

This play has been a treasure chest for me to direct, filled with the things I love most about theatre. Firstly, I adore anything period- the costumes, the style, the beautiful formal manner of speech. This, mixed with elements of fantasy, dancing, music and masks, have combined to form a play rich in colour and excitement.

I have been fortunate to work with a talented cast and crew and thank them all for supporting me in my directorial debut at the Genesian Theatre. We hope you leave the theatre smiling, having enjoyed the light hearted entertainment of Northanger Abbey.


Membership of the company is open to all people over the age of eighteen.

Since 1954 it has been the home of The Genesian Theatre Company, which was formed in 1944.
