
SHAKESPEARES

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Director's Note

I first saw and fell in love with this play at the Seymour Centre in the late 90's. I found myself caught up in the action as the actors stole my programme half way through the show and ripped it apart. I still have that torn up programme, a treasured memento. My girlfriend at the time even took to the stage briefly during that performance, as you yourself may well do this evening...

This show is a joyful celebration of the magic of Shakespeare vigorously mixed with a splash of fun. TOM MASSEY - Director Tom trained at AADA in the 90's, and has worked in all aspects of theatre. Tom appeared in the Australian premiere of Parsley's adaptation of *Brideshead Revisted* for RGP. His most recent of several stage appearances was in *The Winslow Boy* for the Genesian Theatre earlier this year. He has also worked behind the scenes on many productions. For the Genesian he has directed *Noises Off, Dead White Males*, and *The 39 Steps*. In 2012 Tom trained at Atlantic Acting School in NYC. Tom has spent most of his time for the past year working as stage manager for independent theatre companies, including Sure Foot, Eclective, subtlenuance, and the New. His most recent project as SM was working with Gale Edwards for Pacific Opera, and in the bio box for Lex Marinos for the Greek Festival.

SHANE BATES - Assistant Director Shane has been involved with community Theatre since 1987 firstly as a Stage and Production Manager moving in the late 1990's to "treading the boards" herself. Since arriving at the Genesian Theatre in 1996 she has been involved in over 30 productions as an Actor, an Assistant Director and a Director. Shane's previous AD roles over the last few years include *Dead White Males, Richard III,* and *Dangerous Corner*. She has recently directed *The Adventures of Paddington Bear, Charley's Aunt,* and *Hotel Sorrento.* Most recently you would have seen her as Mrs Bennet in *Pride and Prejudice* and The Abbess in *The Three Musketeers.* Shane has a great love of comedy and tries to be involved with any comic production that the Genesian produces.

SUSAN CARVETH - Costume Design Susan is Wardrobe Co-ordinator for the Genesian Theatre. Her credits are extensive and include *A Man for All Seasons, An Ideal Husband, Dead White Males, Crown Matrimonial, Summer of the Seventeenth Doll, By Jeeves, Witness for the Prosecution, Hay Fever, Murder on the Nile, Star Child, Morning Sacrifice, Richard III, and Frankenstein. She has also worked for Opera Australia, ABC, BBC and as costume maker for Tall Poppeas, Ondine Productions, and Opera Bites.*

TIMOTHY M CARTER - Lighting Design An accomplished Lighting Designer, Musical Director and Composer, Tim's formal studies include a Bachelor of Creative Arts (Music Composition), Master of Creative Arts (Theatre Production) and Master of Creative Arts - Research (Theatre Production). Recent Genesian lighting credits include *Pride and Prejudice*, *Hotel Sorrento*, *Murder on the Nile*, *Richard III*, *The Mousetrap*, and *Northanger Abbey*. Musical Director credits include *Spamalot*, *Little Shop of Horrors*, the Sydney premiere of Andrew Lloyd Webber's *By Jeeves*, and the world premiere of *Star Child*. Composition credits include *The Glass Menagerie*, *Saint Joan*, *Charley's Aunt*, *The Living*, *A Chaste Maid in Cheapside*, and a devised production based on his suite *Fragments*.

MARINE GRANGIER - Stage Manager Marine has been attracted to theatre like a perpetual vortex for as long as she can remember. She started acting in France when she was 12, picked up dramaturgy as a minor when she studied in Colorado and has been training in stage management for about a year in Sydney. She has a medical condition that has her smile unconditionally when, from backstage, she hears the audience laughing out loud or when you'd hear a pin drop. And she's not interested in the cure!

WENDY GREENFIELD - Lighting and Sound Operation Wendy became a member of the Genesian Theatre nine years ago and in that time not only has appeared on stage, but has been active as a play reader since 2010 and has been lighting and sound operator on several productions since 2011 including *Money and Friends* and *Hotel Sorrento*. She has also stage managed some of our workshops. Her acting credits at the Genesian include Mrs Bradman in *Blithe Spirit* and the Inspector in *Witness for the Prosecution*.

JESSICA GRAY - Jess Born and raised in the Hunter Valley, Jessica moved to Sydney four years ago to study acting. Graduating from Wesley Institute in 2013 with a Bachelor of Dramatic Art, Jessica has also spent three months training at The Acting Corps in L.A. Jessica's performance highlights include, *Kiss Me Kate* (2011), *The Government Inspector* (2012), *As You Like It* (2012), *Mother's Day* (2013), and *Put that Coffee Down* (2015). When she's not acting (or throwing props and costumes across the stage), Jessica enjoys writing, bushwalking and baking. Jessica is excited to be involved in such a fun production and is truly grateful to the Genesian Theatre for the opportunity to play this role.

JAMIE COLLETTE - James Jamie is a 2011 graduate of Actor's Centre Australia. His theatre credits include *Privates on Parade* and *Sweeney Todd* (New Theatre), *Into The Woods* (CMS), *Good Omens* (HareBrain), *Spring Awakening* (Kore), *Joan Again* (subtlenuance), *And Then There Were None* (Bump In), *The Local* (Last Drinks), *FRIDAY* (SITCO), *Assassins* (Penny Presents), *Man of La Mancha* (NUTS) as well as *Killer Joe, Lakeboat, Reality Bytes, Vassa Zheleznova, All's Well that End's Well*, and *On Top of the World* (ACA). Jamie also toured the country performing for students with Poetry in Action through 2012, playing such wonderful roles as Hamlet, Macbeth, Othello, and Himself.

BARRY NIELSEN - Barry Barry trained at the Actor's Centre and has done the usual number of commercials, unpaid student films and short and not so sweet, both as actor and director. He has done a bit of Willy; including roles in *Lear, Merry Wives*, and *Richard III* at the Genesian. Other acting highlights have been Leon in *Speaking in Tongues* and the triple-gendered role in *Sylvia*. Excellent training for this play! Barry translated and directed Lorca's *Blood Wedding* and *Bernarda Alba* for the Genesian and has the dubious claim to fame of having directed the Genesians' biggest ever hit, *The Mousetrap*. The play writing is dubious, not the success. In his spare time Barry does unspeakable things to small animals, teaches vet nurses at TAFE and has been involved in the theatre's management for many years.

About The Reduced Shakespeare Company

The RSC was founded by Daniel Singer in 1981 around his 25 minute version of *Hamlet* performed with four actors, with Jess Winfield and Adam Long as founding members. This show was performed at various venues and comedy events in the US for a number of years with a few cast changes.

In 1987 they took the show to the Edinburgh Fringe, and decided to include Shakespeare's other plays to fill it out into about an hour to make it a good length for a Fringe slot. This show was then expanded into a 97 minute production that ran for nine years at the Criterion in London's West End.

Since then the RSC have abridged almost everything, including *The Complete History* of *America (Abridged)*, *The Complete Word of God (Abridged)*, *The Complete Millenium Musical (Abridged)*, *All the Great Books (Abridged)*, *Completely Hollywood (Abridged)*, *The Complete World of Sports (Abridged)*, *The Ultimate Christmas Show (Abridged)*, and *The Complete History of Comedy (Abridged)*.

About the Genesian Theatre

Having celebrated our 70th year as a company in 2014, The Genesian Theatre Company has been operating for 60 years from an historic church in Kent Street, in the heart of the Sydney CBD. We boast among our alumni numerous household names in Australian theatre and film such as Bryan Brown, Baz Luhrmann, Judi Farr, and John Bell. We are, however, just as proud of the hundreds of talented amateur actors, directors, designers, lighting and sound specialists who have contributed to Sydney's unique little theatre over the years.

Over the years the company has developed into a theatre providing a training ground for young actors and a place where those who love the theatre can meet, share and extend their knowledge of the performing arts. The Genesian Theatre is one of Sydney's most active theatre companies. In addition to six main stage productions each year we run classes, workshops and many other activities.

The building which houses The Genesian Theatre Company was originally St John's Church, and dates from 1868. It has served as both a church and a poor school until 1932 when it became the Kursaal Theatre, housing the Sydney Repertory Company. In 1938 it became the first Matthew Talbot Hostel. Since 1954 it has been the home of The Genesian Theatre Company which was formed in 1944.
