## **Director's Note**

In October last year I stumbled upon an amateur production of *Our House* at Stratford-Upon-Avon. I knew nothing about the show despite it being an Olivier award winning musical, and being familiar with other work by playwright Tim Firth and some of the hits of Madness.

I thought the tale of a rambunctious Camden lad, and the two possible paths his life might take, was clever, funny, and moving, and I subsequently discovered it had been performed by London's Union theatre with a small cast, much as we are staging it.

This is the Sydney premiere of *Our House* and I couldn't be more grateful to the production team, cast, and crew. The Genesian only occasionally ventures into the musical theatre field and it provides particular challenges for our small theatre but we hope that our efforts to bring you what is in effect a modern morality tale will provide you with an enjoyable evening.

As London's Evening Standard put it: 'This is not just all cheeky, laddish humour, it is about adolescent angst, friendship and loyalty, the importance of family and home - notions that chime well with the more plaintive and touching side of the Madness oeuvre.'

# **Synopsis of Scenes**

Our House is set largely in Camden, London, with excursions to other areas of London and a brief visit to Las Vegas! The show follows two different versions of events (the black and white versions) after Joe Casey's 16th birthday.

**ROGER GIMBLETT - Director** Roger is the Theatre Director of the Genesian Theatre. He has directed 12 major productions for the Theatre including the Sydney premiere of Andrew Lloyd Webbers *By Jeeves*, the world premiere of Mel Morrow's *Dickens Down Under*, and his own musical adaptation of Oscar Wilde's *The Star Child*. Roger previously directed extensively in New Zealand and the UK and has completed the short course in directing at RADA and voice workshops with the RSC.

**TIMOTHY M CARTER - Musical Director** An active member with the Genesian Theatre for many years, Tim has designed, directed, and composed for the company. With a Bachelors degree in music composition and two Masters degrees in theatre production, he is looking forward to being a guest lecturer at the Hanoi Academy of Theatre and Cinema at the end of October in Vietnam.

**DEBBIE SMITH - Choreographer** For the GTC, Debbie has directed *Journey's End*, *And Then There Were None*, *Cards on the Table*, *Enchanted April*, *Shadowlands*, *Coward at Christmas*, *Frankenstein*, *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, and *Far from the Madding Crowd*. She was Assistant Directed on *Northanger Abbey*, Money and Friends, and *Sherlock Holmes*, and choreographed for *Dickens Down Under*, *By Jeeves*, *Northanger Abbey*, *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, and *Starchild*. *Our House* is the fourth musical she has worked on with Roger. She hasn't stopped dancing since she first heard the score.

**OWEN GIMBLETT - Set Design** Owen has over 25 mainstage Set Design credits to his name at the Genesian alone and countless more in his native New Zealand. Over a 50 year career he has worked on plays, ballet, and major musicals, and enjoys the challenges of Genesian's intimate stage with *The Tempest* and *Great Expectations* being particularly memorable designs. In a change of hat, Owen directed *Pygmalion* and *Pride and Prejudice* for the company.

**SUSAN CARVETH - Costume Design** Susan is Wardrobe Co-ordinator for the Genesian Theatre. Her wardrobe credits include *A Man for All Seasons, An Ideal Husband, Dead White Males, Crown Matrimonial, Summer of the Seventeenth Doll, By Jeeves, Witness for the Prosecution, Hay Fever, Murder on the Nile, Star Child, Morning Sacrifice, Richard III, Frankenstein, The Three Musketeers, and Go Back for Murder. She has also worked for Opera Australia, ABC, BBC, Tall Poppeas, Ondine Productions, and Opera Bites. Sometimes she even gets to tread the boards!* 

**HELEN KOHLHAGEN - Costume Design** Helen has worked in all aspects of theatre, starting from her early days in high school with a production of *The Wiz*. Over the following years Helen has costumed many actors in many roles across many plays. Her stand out productions are *Shadowlands* for Phoenix Theatre and *The Night Herron* directed by Helen Tonkin. Helen's other credits include *The Talented Mr Ripley*, *Hotel Sorrento*, and *Twelve Angry Men*.

**MICHAEL SCHELL - Sound & Lighting Design** Michael has been a member of the Genesian Theatre for over 35 years. A professional Sound and Lighting Designer, his Genesian credits include *Great Expectations*, *St Joan*, *The 39 Steps*, *Terra Nova*, *Frankenstein*, and *Sherlock Holmes: The Final Adventure*. Other recent Genesian sound design credits include *Pride and Prejudice*, *The Mousetrap*, *Crown Matrimonial*, *Spider's Web*, and *Three Sisters*.



MATT CLARK - Joe Casey Matthew started singing in Gondwana Voices and Sydney Children's Choir, touring to China, America, Canada, and New Zealand, also performing on film soundtracks and at the Arias. Matthew performed in Opera Australia's productions of *Carmen*, *La Boheme*, *Billy* 

Budd, and Werther, as well as solo roles in Tannhauser and Pilgrims Progress.

**RACHEL HERTZ - Sarah** Rachel is passionate about singing, dancing, and acting. In 2015 she was the only soloist to perform to more than 3000 people at her school's music festival. Rachel's previous credits include *The Big Makado*, Packemin's youth productions of *Joseph and the Amazing* 



Technicolour Dreamcoat, and Back to the Eighties, as well as SYMT's 42nd Street.



**MELANIE ROBINSON - Kath** Melanie's acting credits for the Genesian include *Hotel Sorrento*, *Blithe Spirit*, *Noises Off*, *Hay Fever*, *An Ideal Husband*, and *Midsummer Night's Dream*. Other favourite roles include *Calendar Girls*, *Daylight Saving*, *Harbour*, *God of Carnage*, *The Blonde*, the

Brunette and the Vengeful Redhead, Transparency, and Over the Moon and Far Away.

**GEOFF STONE - Joe's Dad** This is Geoff's first production with GTC. He's delighted to be a part of this Sydney premiere of *Our House!* Geoff was recently seen in *Catch Me if You Can* with Willoughby TC. Geoff's favorite roles include King Arthur in *Spamalot*, Mr Potts in *Chitty Chitty Bang Bang*, Judas in *Jesus Christ Superstar*, and the Dentist in *Little Shop of Horrors*.



# **About the Genesian Theatre**

The Genesian Theatre Company celebrated our 70th year as a company in 2014. For over 60 years we have been operating from an historic church in Kent Street, in the heart of the Sydney CBD. We boast among our alumni numerous household names in Australian theatre and film such as Bryan Brown, Baz Luhrmann, Judi Farr, and John Bell. We are also just as proud of the hundreds of other talented actors, directors, designers, lighting and sound specialists who have contributed to Sydney's unique little theatre.

Over the years the company has developed into a theatre providing a training ground for young actors and a place where those who love the theatre can meet, share and extend their knowledge of the performing arts. The Genesian Theatre is one of Sydney's most active theatre companies. In addition to six main stage productions each year we run classes, workshops and many other activities.

The building which houses The Genesian Theatre Company was originally St John's Church, and dates from 1868. It has served as both a church and a poor school until 1932 when it became the Kursaal Theatre, housing the Sydney Repertory Company. In 1938 it became the first Matthew Talbot Hostel. Since 1954 it has been the home of The Genesian Theatre Company which was formed in 1944.

The Genesian Theatre Company acknowledges the Gadigal people of the Eora Nation as the traditional custodians of the land our theatre stands on.
