


Celebrating the works of Nick Enright and his composer collaborators



Devised by David Mitchell & Melvyn Morrow

NICK ENRIGHT (1950 - 2003) was a playwright, actor, director, screenwriter, lyricist, translator / adaptor, dramaturg and teacher.

He grew up in Maitland, NSW and went to school at St Ignatius' College, Riverview where he was taught by Melvyn Morrow. He graduated from Sydney University with a BA in 1972

During 1971 and 1972 Enright was a member of the Genesian Theatre, performing in *A Doll's House* and *Uncle Vanya*, and directing *London Assurance*.

He started working in theatre for J. C. Williamson from the age of 16, and soon was working with Nimrod Theatre and MTC.

He later studied playwriting with Israel Horovitz at the New York University School of Arts.

His plays include On the Wallaby, Daylight Saving, St James Infirmary, Mongrels, A Property of the Clan, The Quartet from Rigoletto, Blackrock, Good Works, Playgrounds, Spurboard, Chasing the Dragon, and A Poor Student. With Justin Monjo he adapted Tim Winton's Cloudstreet which played in all Australian capitals as well as London, Zurich, Dublin, Washington and New York. His last professional play was A Man with Five Children.

For film Nick wrote *Lorenzo's Oil* with George Miller (nominated for Academy and WGA Awards for Best Original Screenplay), and *Blackrock*; and for television *Coral Island* and the miniseries *Come in Spinner*. Both series were nominated for AFI awards.

With composer Terence Clarke, he wrote the musicals *The Venetian Twins* and *Summer Rain*. Other musical collaborations include *Miracle City* with Max Lambert, *Mary Bryant* and *The Good Fight* with David King and the book for *The Boy From Oz* which toured to great success both in Australia and on Broadway.

Nick received the 1998 Sidney Myer Performing Arts Award and was posthumously awarded the 2003 Variety Humanitarian Lifetime Achievement Award and the Special Award at the 2003 Premier's Literary Awards.

In June 2004 his appointment as a Member of the Order of Australia was posthumously announced. The citation read: 'For service to the performing arts, particularly as a playwright, teacher, actor, director, and as a mentor of emerging talent'.

DAVID MITCHELL David recently co-wrote *Doris: So Much More Than The Girl Next Door* with Melinda Schneider. With Melvyn Morrow, David co-wrote *SHOUT!*, which broke box-office records around Australia, and *Dusty*, which won four Helpmann Awards in 2006. David has written for Barbra Streisand, Bob Hope, Michael Parkinson, Barry Humphries, Clive James, Ronnie Corbett, Lorna Luft, and the late Danny la Rue. As TV producer, David's shows include, *The Mike Walsh Show, Parkinson, Saturday Night Clive, The Dame Edna Experience*, Barry Humphries' *Flashbacks, This is Your Life*, and his *Royal Bicentennial Concert* in 1988 which starred Olivia Newton-John, Peter Allen, and Kylie Minogue. He is currently producing and directing a Foxtel series to honour the Equity Lifetime Achievement winners and devising a show with Cameron Daddo.

MELVYN MORROW Melvyn's first scripts were performed at the Phillip Theatre, Downstairs Revue, and *Mavis Bramston Show*. Musicals include *Morality!*, *Postcards From Provence*, *Vroom Vroom*, *Mad Louisa Lawson*, *Offenbach In The Underworld*, When It Happens, and *Christmas at The Opera House*. TV includes *Sons and Daughters*, *Mike Walsh*, *Star Search*, *Tribute to Dame Joan Sutherland and Richard Bonynge*. *A Song To Sing*, *O* was produced in London. Melvyn updated G & S for OA and Simon Gallaher. With David Mitchell, Melvyn co-wrote *SHOUT!* and *Dusty*. Plays include *Beating A Retreat*, *A Touch Of Paradise Vice*. Cabarets include *Broadway Bard*, *Tae Kwon Shakespeare*, *Mozart* & *Me*. *Shakespearean Idol* won a 2006 AWGIE. With Dion Condack, Melvyn recently wrote and directed *Dorian Gray Naked*.

ROGER GIMBLETT - Director Roger is the Theatre Director of the Genesian Theatre. He has directed 13 major productions for the Theatre including the Sydney premiere of Andrew Lloyd Webbers *By Jeeves*, the world premiere of Mel Morrow's *Dickens Down Under*, and his own musical adaptation of Oscar Wilde's *The Star Child*. Roger previously directed extensively in New Zealand and the UK and has completed the short course in directing at RADA and voice workshops with the RSC.

DEBBIE SMITH - Choreographer / Associate Director For the GTC, Debbie directed Journey's End, And Then There Were None, Cards on the Table, Enchanted April, Shadowlands, Coward at Christmas, Frankenstein, A Midsummer Night's Dream, and Far from the Madding Crowd. She was Assistant Director on Northanger Abbey, Money and Friends, and Sherlock Holmes: The Final Adventure, and choreographed for Dickens Down Under, By Jeeves, Northanger Abbey, Starchild, and Our House.

MICHAEL SCHELL - Lighting and Sound Design Michael has been a member of the Genesian Theatre for over 40 years. A professional Sound and Lighting Designer, his Genesian credits include *Great Expectations*, St Joan, The 39 Steps, Terra Nova, Frankenstein, and Sherlock Holmes: The Final Adventure. Other recent Genesian sound design credits include Pride and Prejudice, The Mousetrap, Crown Matrimonial, Spider's Web, Three Sisters, Our House, and Dracula.



ANGELA AYERS Angela is an icon in the entertainment industry throughout Australia and NZ. She became the Golden Girl on NZ TV in the 70's through her appearances on *Happen Inn* and *Sing*. By her early 20's she had two hit records. This led to her being named "New Zealand's Queen of Television" and "Most Popular Female Artist". After moving to Australia she won the role of Maggie in *A Chorus Line* subsequently winning a scholarship to study ballet/jazz in LA. A stream of roles in musical theatre kept her in Australia throughout the 80's including *West Side Story, Rocky Horror Show, Joseph*

and the Amazing Technicolour Dreamcoat, Cabaret, Chicago, and Guys and Dolls with Anthony Warlow and the late Ricky May. In the 80's Angela moved to London but returned to Australia to star in the National Tour of *Jerry's Girls* alongside Marcia Hines. Judi Connelli, and Jeannie Little. In 1998 she wrote her own show entitled I Can Cook Too performing with the jazz pianist Ray Alldridge. This show toured Australia and NZ to rave reviews. In a career of many highlights Angela rates one of them as singing the NZ National Anthem to over 90,000 people at the Bledisloe Cup at the MCG. Angela has appeared on national variety shows including Don Lane Show, Mike Walsh Show, Ray Martin and Kerrie Ann Kennerley show, Hey Hey It's Saturday, Countdown, plus the Two Ronnie's Television specials. She was a favourite entertainer in the 80's and 90's on the cruise ships and entertained the troops in the Sinai with the late Ricky May. Returning to NZ she starred in 42nd St. Jerry's Girls, Mum's the Word, Shortland Street, Spin Doctors, and Menopause the Musical both in Australia and NZ. In 2014 Angela played Miss Potts in Hairy Maclary at the Opera House. Angela's cabaret show is in demand and is popular with the Senior Citizens Concerts alongside her new show Simple Dreams: The songs of Linda Ronstadt. Currently she is working with fellow jazz musicians and appearing at Opera Bar and Golden Sheaf Hotel.

a young boy, Dion appeared with OA in *Tosca*, *Hansel and Gretel*, *The Magic Flute*, *Tannhauser*, and *Batavia*. Dion attended Newtown High School of the Performing Arts. Roles include *Bugs*, Tony in *West Side Story* (PLC), *Burgundian Consort* (UNSW), *Speed Dating Tonight* (GWU), and his USA debut in *Dion Condack Live* at GWU. He holds Bachelor degrees in Music and Education (UNSW). He coordinated NHSPA choirs in their 25th Anniversary. After his album *Suddenly* he spent a year in Brazil including a performance at



Teatro Municipal de Nova Friburgo. He has worked at The Arts Unit and taught in many schools. With Melvyn Morrow he wrote the musicals *Heaven* and *Dorian Gray Naked*. Dion's latest singles *Bordeaux* and *Falling Down (ft Dobby)* were released in 2018.



JULIETTE COATES This production is close to Juliette's heart as she grew up in Newcastle, graduating from both the Hunter School of the Performing Arts and the Talent Development Project (Syd). Her love for the stage led her to Sydney, where she obtained her Dip of Musical Theatre from Brent Street and signed with Focus Talent. Juliette was offered a teaching position at Brent Street. Her roles include Millie Dilmount in Thoroughly Modern Millie (HSPA), Penny Pinkleton in Hairspray (Metropolitan players), Aunt Eller in Oklahoma (Brent Street), Martha in Spring Awakening (Brent Street). She

has also been a part of *Les Misérables*, *How to Succeed in Business & Annie*. She performed alongside Bev Kennedy as a part of Future Stars of Musical Theatre. Juliette plans to fulfil her dreams of becoming a professional theatre performer.

ROSANNA HURLEY Rosanna is grateful to have the pleasure of bringing a variety of beautiful Enright songs, poems and quotes to the stage in this production. Her past credits include *The Importance of Being Earnest* (as Cecily), *Legally Blonde* (as Elle Woods), *What Santa Does Other Days of the Year* (as Snowflake), *Haunted* (as the Ghost), *Grease* (as Sandy), *Kismet* (as Marsinah), and *The Phantom of the Opera* (as the Princess in *Hannibal*). Her other favourite credits include roles in *La Cage Aux Folles*, *My Fair Lady*, *Jesus Christ Superstar*, *Les Misérables*, *Singin' in the Rain*, *Chicago*, *Oklahoma*, *The*



Mikado, and *Sunset Boulevard*. Rosanna has also been seen as a featured soprano for Art Song Canberra. In 2015, she was crowned Miss World ACT, raising funds for Variety (the Children's Charity) in the process.



LANA DOMENEY Lana Domeney, 21, recently graduated from Ed5international where she trained in musical theatre full time for two years. Previous to that she starred as Jennyanydots in *Cats* the musical and Tiffany in *Back To The 80's* with Packemin Productions. Other Packemin shows she's been part of include *Wicked*, *The Wizard of Oz*, and *Annie*. Lana also played the lead of Kate in the workshop of *Connected* the musical at the Zenith theatre. Lana graduated from high school at the McDonald College of Performing Arts where she majored in Musical Theatre and Dance with

Dolores Dunbar and Jane Beckett. Lana is honoured to be part of this tribute to such a prolific Australian playwright, Nick Enright, and looks forward to sharing his story with you.


The building which houses the Genesian Theatre Company was originally St John's Church, and dates from 1868. It served as both a church and a poor school until 1932 when it became the Kursaal Theatre, housing the Sydney Repertory Company. In 1938 it became the first Matthew Talbot Hostel. Since 1954 it has been the home of the Genesian Theatre Company which was formed in 1944.

The Genesian Theatre Company acknowledges the Gadigal people of the Eora Nation as the traditional custodians of the land our theatre stands on.
